

HOW DOES IT WORK?

When you buy a Discover Ferrari & Pavarotti Land Passport, valid for 48 hours, you can use our shuttles throughout the day which follow a route full of attractive destinations that you are free to decide whether to visit or not. You can stop off at each place you decide to visit for one hour when the shuttle will pass to take you to your next destination. You can stop off several times in one day depending on your tastes and interests. Anyone who wants to stop off in Modena and the surrounding area for a gourmet evening can continue with the programme the day after and, on request, even extend it to a third day. Don't forget that this is home to one of the most famous chefs in the world, Massimo Bottura with his Osteria Francescana in Modena, as well as dozens of great masters of cuisine who are all worthy of a visit. Anyone who wants to use the services offered by the Discover Passport using their own car or, for groups, a coach rather than the shuttle will be free to do so - all they have to do is observe the hourly intervals so that they can take part in the guided tours.

A Passport for everyone.

The passport, in credit card format with a microchip that guarantees access, at the price of 60 euros, gives the holder the right to use the shuttle service and access all tour facilities. Isn't 60 euros cheap for all this?

Maybe, but the people at Maranello, Modena, Sassuolo, Carpi and Nonantola love to make a good impression!

WHERE DO THE SHUTTLES LEAVE FROM?

Every morning from the high speed line stations at Bologna and Reggio Emilia Mediopadana, Modena station and the big Novi Park car park in Modena. Passport holders can take them at any point along the route, for example, in front of the two Ferrari museums in Maranello and Modena, and will be dropped off at the same point later in the day.

WHICH ARE THE STOPS AND THE PLACES TO VISIT?

Every stop has its own attraction: the city of Modena with its old historic centre, the Estense Gallery, the Romanesque Cathedral with its "Ghirlandina" tower and Nonantola with its Abbey of Matilda of Canossa, Sassuolo with its wonderful Ducal Palace, Carpi with Palazzo Pio as well as the fashion scene and Maranello with Ferrari. All the towns and cities offer a wide variety of attractions for those who take part in Discover Ferrari & Pavarotti Land: restaurants, hotels and farms of all categories, traditional workshops and all sorts of local products. Modena is also home to the Piacere Modena, housed in an 18th century building in the gardens of the Ducal Palace,

with a whole range of gourmet products. There are also the designated shuttle stops at Ferrari and its museums, the Pavarotti Foundation with the Maestro's Villa and the house museum, the museum of great Modena charcuterie, MuSa, and the Bio Hombre farm estate with its amazing collection of racing and road Maserati. Other destinations are the famous balsamic vinegar cellars, the Lambrusco cellars and the Parmigiano Reggiano dairies.

That's not all: in Sassuolo you can see the most famous ceramics in the world and in Carpi, the world of Italian fashion.

A special programme in Sassuolo.
To discover the special world of Sassuolo ceramics, a special shuttle service takes visitors to the Museum of Ceramics at Spezzano and other places that show how technology and art are combined to achieve excellence.

HOW CAN YOU TAKE PART IN DISCOVER FERRARI & PAVAROTTI LAND?

Through all major tour operators or booking the service from a travel agents or, even more simply, buying the passport on line and making your own way to Modena, Bologna or Mediopadana. You can purchase the passport through the websites of participating companies and directly on the shuttle if places are available (please note that we cannot guarantee availability...!).
